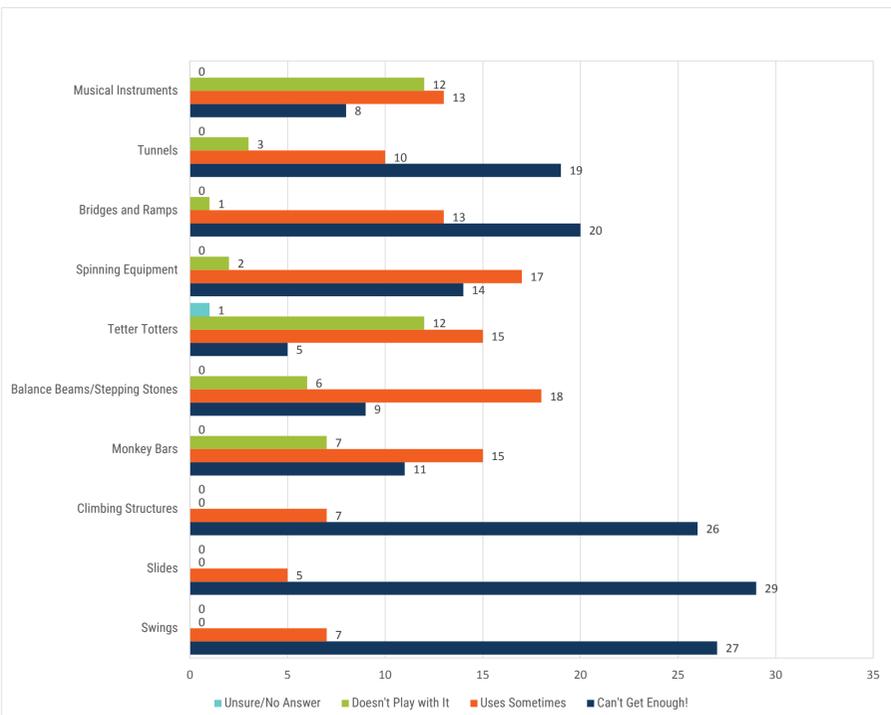

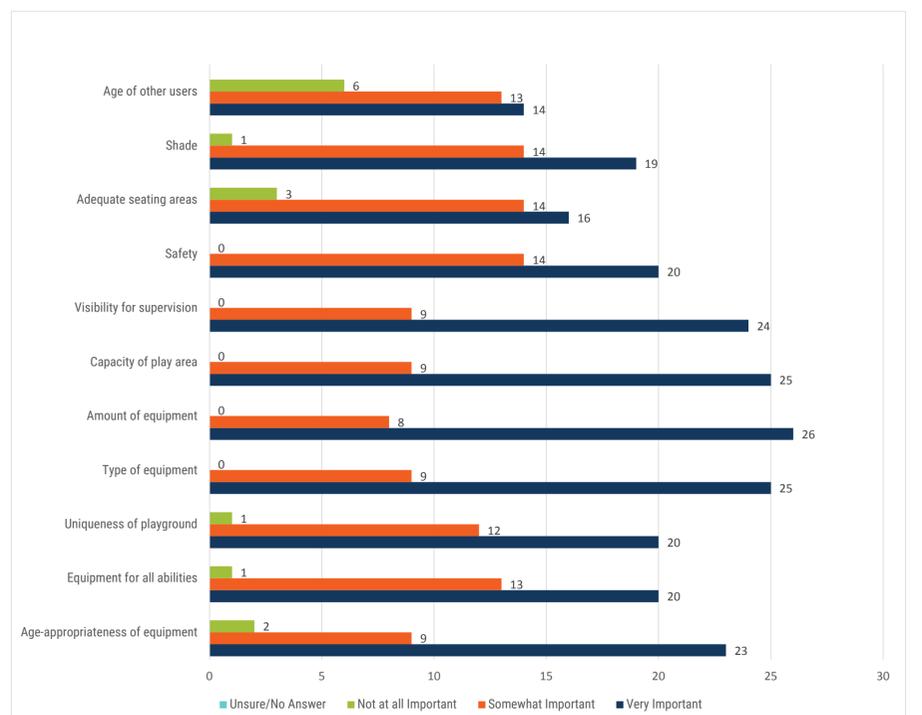
SURVEY PERIOD

Please make sure it has equipment suitable for a WIDE VARIETY of ages (18 months to 12 years). Some favourites of my day home kids are slides, zip lines, swings that more than one person can fit on, net climbers, monkey bars, little seats that spin (NOT those large pyramid net spinners). Lots of climbing equipment. Stuff to balance on and jump on. Natural elements to climb on and over...logs, stumps, large rocks.

Unique with options for all ages. No gravel, ground like Nicholas Sheran train playground. Make it new and exciting.

The Fort Macleod park zip line is HUGE with my kids!

Purposeful play. Allow for freedom and the exercise of imagination, but still prioritizing skills necessary for child development.

Big with lots of high places to climb and play on top of. If you go to other playgrounds in town, the busiest areas are always the way up high spots.

Would love areas with hopscotch, etc. Picnic tables, benches, lighting, shade providers, bike rack, good spot to park strollers and wagons.

A playground for kids age 10-13. Both of my kids still like the idea of parks but get bored too quickly. Ensuring there's enough uniqueness like a maze or recycled tire climber, something that can keep the older ones engaged and active.

Natural things to climb under, over, around and crawl through or jump across and balance on and swing on. A big area to run around and a small persons bike path going around and through it. A factor of healthy risk as well.

Super accessible for children with walkers! Spinning swings! Lots of slides and other swings!!

It would be large enough and varied enough to grow up with my child. Many playgrounds in the city are quite small and seem to be engaging to toddlers, but as children get a little bit older there is not enough variety in equipment to engage them which may force us to have to seek a park that is larger or more suited to their age.

It would have something for all levels. I would also like to see things that help my children strategize and have a level of risk.

The park will be heavily used by many kids in and around Crossings. I hope it is large enough to accommodate the number of kids that will visit the park.

Although I think general safety is important, I also think that it is important for children to not be excessively sheltered from risk. When choosing equipment it would be great to know that children will have the ability to play creatively with a bit of healthy risk. A playground that is too safe isn't a whole lot of fun!

Great for all ages. Unique yet has classics. Safe and shaded. Seating for parents.

Rubberized playground surface, no rocks/gravel! A large playground for young children up to age 10+. Areas that are challenging for older elementary aged kids. Swings, lots of climbing features. A ninja park is always fun. The addition of a scooter/bike park features would be great.
